ADRA is a worldwide faith based organization that was founded in 1956 by the Seventh - day Adventist church. The branch office in Bosnia was founded in 1992. It is a part of the worldwide ADRA network with its presence in over 135 countries in the world. The mission of the organization in Bosnia is to work with people in poverty and distress to create just and positive change through empowering partnerships and responsible actions. With their Motto being: Justice. Compassion. Love. The organisation is headed by a Director who is also responsible for the welfare of the entire organisation in Bosnia. ADRA had two branches in Bosnia, one in Sarajevo and one in Banja Luka. The office in Banja Luka where I worked has 3 permanent staff who oversee the activities of the organisation. Aside that, the sewing project dubbed "Divas redesign" has about 6 women with disability who are responsible for the sewing

I also spoke with the director of the organisation beforehand for some requiremenst and what is expected from me as an intern, this heal-ped me prepare adequately for the task that laid before me. This made it easy for me to find my way out in my new position within a very short time and impact massively during my internship.
